- ★ Brazil was Texas' 3rd export destination in 2013 with \$10.86 billion in exports. Texas top exports to Brazil were petroleum and coal products; machinery (except electrical); chemicals; plastics and rubber products; and cereals.
- ★ Brazil was Texas' 15th import source country in 2013. Texas' \$4.61 billion in Brazilian imports included mineral fuels and oils; organic chemicals; industrial machinery; beverages and spirits; and stone and plaster.



According to Bloomberg and fDi Markets' combined data, between 2003 and 2014, Brazilian companies recorded 22 Texas investment projects, \$6.72 billion in FDI, and created 2,153 jobs.




